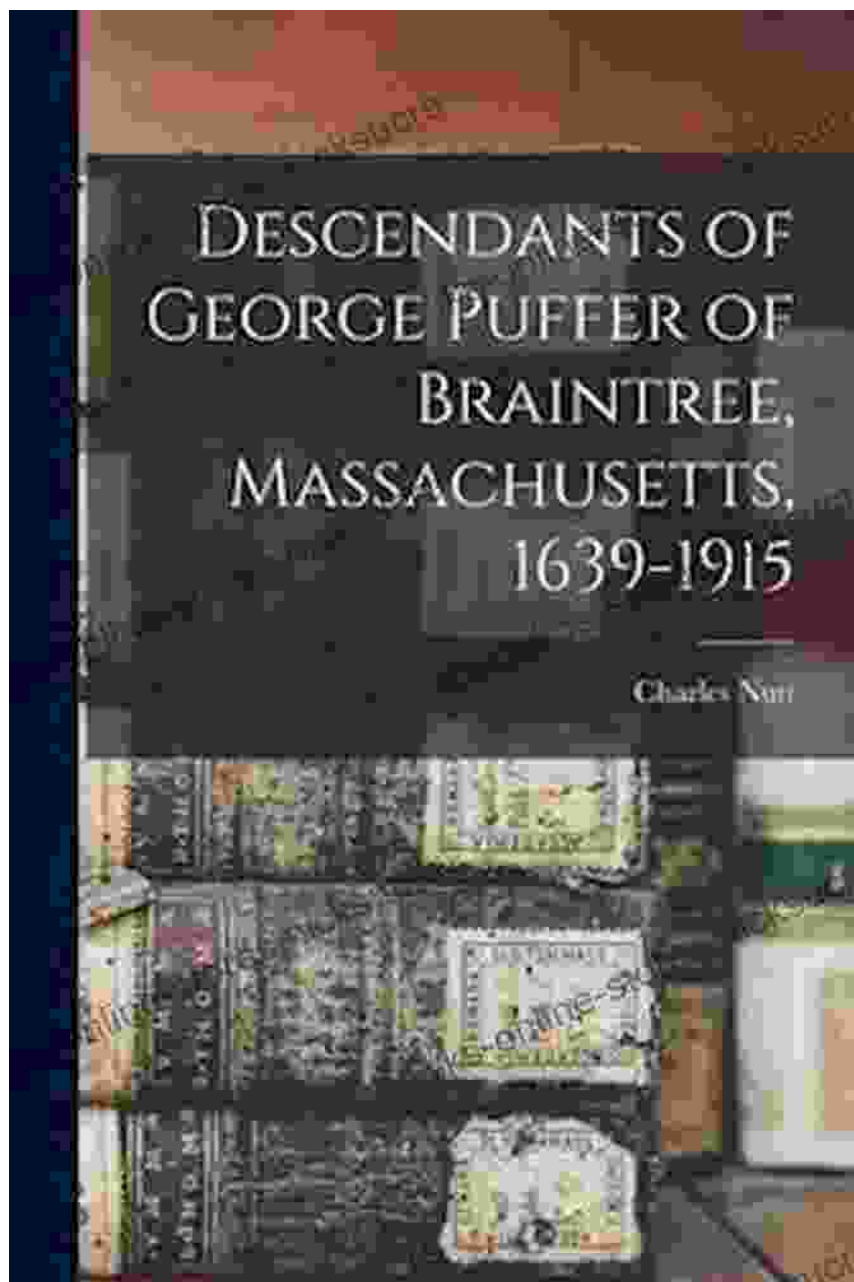
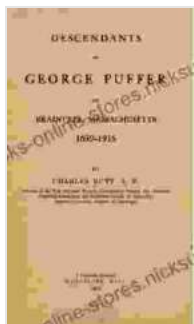


Descendants of George Puffer of Braintree, Massachusetts, 1639–1915

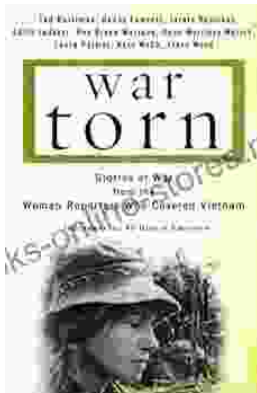

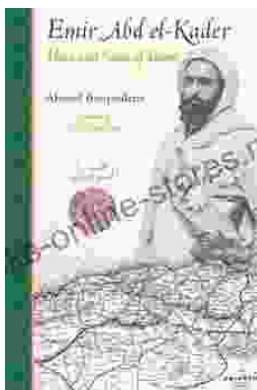
