
Diversity, Equity, Accessibility, and Inclusion in Museums: The American Alliance of Museums' Perspective



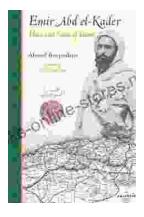
