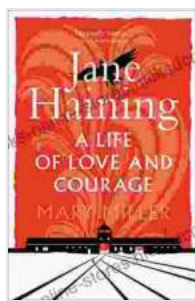


Jane Haining: A Life of Love and Courage

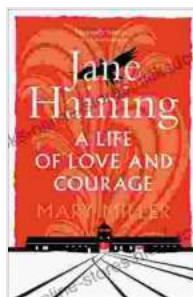

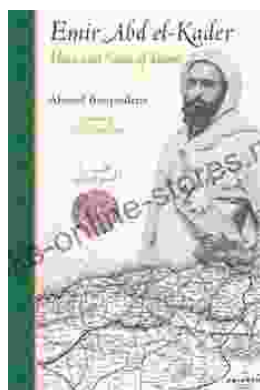
