
Mayor Rob Ford: Uncontrollable: How I Tried To Help The World S Most Notorious Mayor

My Reflections



However, I learned a lot from my experience working for Mayor Ford. I learned about the dangers of addiction, and I learned about the importance of compassion.

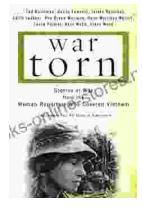

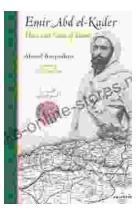
