
My Bumblebee Story (Nature Adventures)



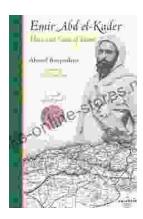
