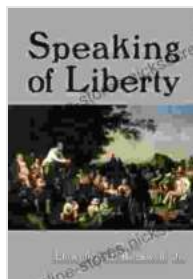


Speaking of Liberty: Llewellyn Rockwell's Enduring Legacy of Liberty

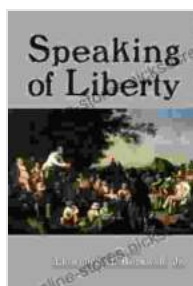

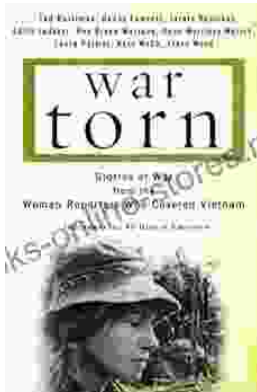

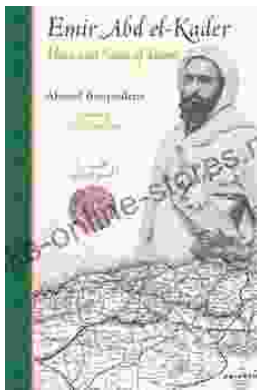
