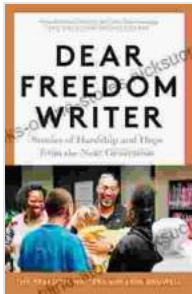

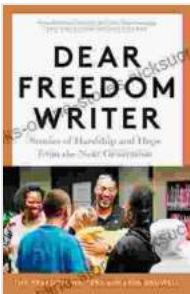
Community Organizer: Mari Copeny
