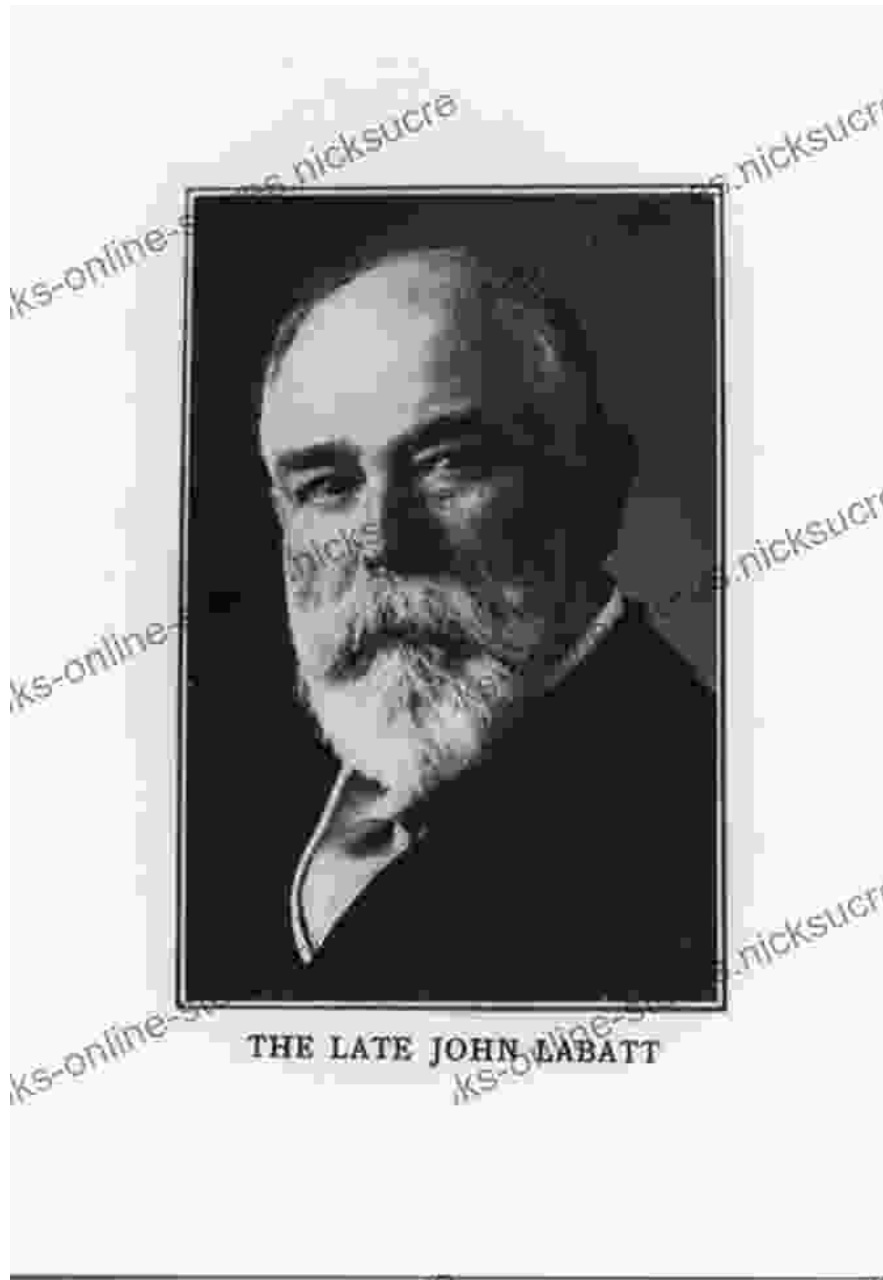

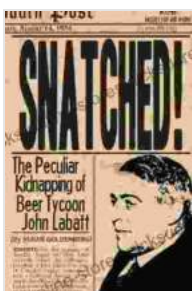
Prologue

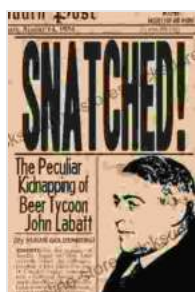

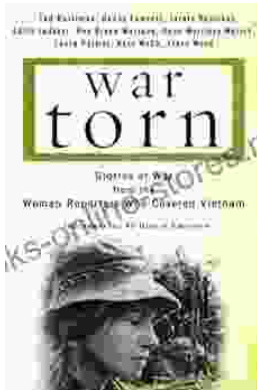

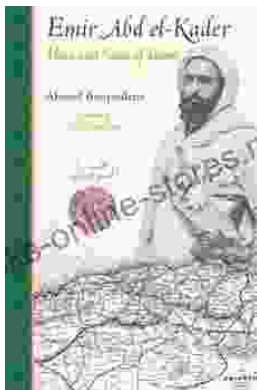
