



Our journey was long and difficult, but it was worth every ounce of effort. We are so grateful for the doctors, nurses, and researchers who helped us save our daughter's life.

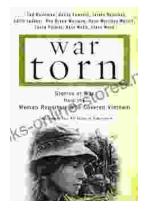

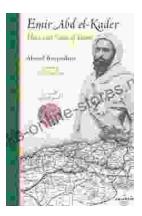
